Program Structure

A minimum of 12 semester hours (sh) is required for the completion of the CUGS in Forensic Studies. Students will be required to take at least three Forensic courses for 9-10 (sh). Beyond the required 9-10 (sh), students can choose to: take an additional **Forensic course** or take a course from the **Electives Bank** for an additional 3-4 (sh), for a total of

12-14 (sh) to fulfill the minimum requirement. Students may choose to take additional courses from the Electives Bank. Students should consult with the Forensic Studies Coordinator, Dr. Maria Rosado, in declaring the CUGS in Forensic Studies and in planning their program of study.
