## SPANISH MINOR

The Spanish Minor offers a flexible curriculum with many opportunities for selection of courses in the Spanish language and in Spanish and Spanish American civilization, culture, literature and linguistics. It provides a general background for future professional studies and advanced degrees in Spanish and work in a wide variety of fields, such as social, administrative and governmental work, as well as international business.

The program may be declared in the Department of World Languages, Oak Hall 107, or by contacting the University Advising Center, Savitz Hall, Suite 323 (856-256-4459 / advise@rowan.edu). Students with existing proficiency in Spanish should contact Esther Mas (mas@rowan.edu) regarding the placement exam. Students may earn the credits for any skipped courses via the Authorization for Credit by Examination process and these credits are counted in fulfillment of minor requirements. Students who have declared the program may schedule an advising appointment with the Program Advisor, Harold Thompson (thompsonh@rowan.edu).

In order to satisfy the requirements for the Spanish Minor, students must take 18 SH credits in Spanish. These 18 SH may be completed through:

- Taking any of the courses listed below, each of which is 3 credits. All courses must be passed with a letter grade of "C-" or better and no courses may be taken P/NC.
- Transferring credits into the Spanish Minor, including from study abroad, and up to 9 s.h. from Advanced Placement and the CLEP Exam. Students planning to study abroad must meet with Esther Mas (mas@rowan.edu) in order to determine course equivalents.
