

Rowan Core/Rowan Experience Guidelines

ROWAN CORE - Starting in the fall of 2018, all incoming first-year students are required to follow the new Rowan Core/Rowan Experience general education model. The Rowan Core is based on six **literacies** (ability to think, understand and effectively work with information in given domain) that reflect contemporary priorities while maintaining a strong liberal arts foundation. The literacies are:

Communicative, Quantitative and *Scientific* Literacy requirements are fulfilled by the prescribed courses in your program of study (i.e., Composition I, Sophomore Engineering Clinic, Calculus, Chemistry, Introductory Mechanics, etc.) and are integrated in the engineering curriculum. The *Artistic, Global* and *Humanistic literacies* are fulfilled by courses you select. These are designated as *Rowan Core Elective* on your respective major's curriculum guide.

ROWAN EXPERIENCE - The *Rowan Experience* requirement consists of Rowan Seminar (RS), Writing Intensive (WI), and Broad-Based Literature (LIT).
